INNER-CITY homes are among those named the best in the country, securing coveted short-listed spots in the national Houses Awards for 2016.

Architectural designs in West End and Hamilton were named finalists in the New House Under 200sq m category while properties at Wilston and Woolloowin made the top list for House Alterations and Additions Under 200sq m.

At Highgate Hill, a stunning duplex created out of the ruins of four flats grabbed a finals spot in the Apartment or Unit category.
